






Kindergarten Math Reference Sheet

Math Term	Example
<p>One to One Correspondance- assigning 1 and only 1 number to a group of objects to answer how many.</p>	
<p>Rote Counting- counting from 0-20.</p>	<p>0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20</p>
<p>Missing Number- be able to write in a number that is missing from a number line.</p>	<p>0, 1, <u> </u>, 3, 4</p> <p><u> </u>, 6, 7, <u> </u>, 9, 10</p>
<p>One More- count and assign 1 more than a given number.</p>	
<p>One less- count and assign 1 less than a given number.</p>	 <p>1 less than 5 = 4</p>
<p>Number Bond—a model used to show part, part, whole (total)</p> <p><i>Number bonds help students see that numbers can be "broken" into pieces to make solving problems easier.</i></p>	
<p>Dot cards- Cards that represent the number using dots 1-10.</p>	
<p>Number sentence – a written expression of addition/subtraction problems</p>	<p>$5 + 2 = 7$</p> <p>$10 - 2 = 8$</p> <p>$10 = 9 + 1$</p> <p>$4 = 5 - 1$</p>
<p>Doubles - when two of the same number are added together</p>	<p>$5 + 5 = 10$</p> <p>$2 + 2 = 4$</p>
